#### Pastor Mark's Remarks

Hi Friends,

Recently a good friend of mine from another state visited a worship service at Freedom for the very first time. Because my friend is a man of strong faith and spiritual maturity, I was intrigued to hear what his initial impression was of Freedom Church. As he described what he saw and felt at Freedom, one word kept coming up again and again. And that word was HUNGER.

The thing that he noticed more than anything among the people of Freedom Church was a deep hunger for more. He sensed a hunger for more than just ritual or religion, more than a Sunday morning spiritual fix, more than good music and thought-provoking preaching, more than smooth productions that make us laugh and cry, and more than what most of us grew up calling "church."

I can't think of many words that I find more encouraging or accurate to describe the people of Freedom Church than *hungry*. Why do I say that? I say that because there is little of value that you can do with people who are not hungry. They are already satisfied, and satisfied people aren't willing to stretch, sacrifice, change or take risks. But hungry people will go to great lengths to see their hunger satisfied.

Jesus said in Matthew 5:6, "*Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for God's approval. They will be satisfied."* What a great promise! Jesus blesses the hungry with exactly what they need. I am so encouraged by what I see happening at Freedom Church. Spiritual hunger is something that cannot be manufactured. It can only be created by the Holy Spirit. And rest assured that when the Holy Spirit creates a hunger, He fully intends to supply what we hunger for.

So I want to ask you: What are you hungry for? What do you yearn to see God do in your life, in your family, and in Freedom Church? And are you asking God to move powerfully and accomplish these things? Are you coming to worship hungry, prayed-up, and expectant that God will pour out fresh manna from heaven to fill our hungry souls?

God has huge dreams and plans for Freedom Church. And a vital step in seeing these things become a reality is for His people to be filled with a deep hunger for more. Do you feel that rumbling from the deepest part of your being, calling you to something more? It's the stirring of God's Spirit, preparing us for what He has planned. May that holy hunger continue to grow and be completely satisfied by Him in the months and years to come.

Thank you for being a people who are not content with the past or with less than what God wants to do!

## **Celebrate Recovery Ministry**

One of the greatest gifts we can offer ourselves . . .

This gift will not come in a box or wrapped with a ribbon. This gift will be more in the form of a decision. It comes in the power provided through an act of forgiveness. In our Recovery Ministry, we frequently witness the freedom experienced when we decide to let go of bitterness and resentment; when we come to grips with the idea that holding on to anger and grudges is at the center of our struggle for peace and happiness. We find that our struggle to demand justice and accountability for the perceived wrongdoing of others frequently causes us more harm than the initial act. Time and time again we find that at the root of compulsive behaviors is a buried pain. It is not easy and harder still when these circumstances seem to demonstrate that we have every right to be upset. It is the hanging on that gets us, the refusal to let go. In this idea, we are not attempting to settle the questions of blame, justice and fairness, but are working for healing and to open the door to allowing some relationships a chance at starting over.

One of the most liberating points in practicing the Celebrate Recovery principles comes in principle six: Evaluate all my relationships. Offer forgiveness to those who have hurt me and make amends for harm I've done to others when possible, except when to do so would harm them or others.

This same principle is found in Matthew 5:7 and 5:9, "Happy are the merciful; Happy are the peacemakers."

Where do we start this process? We have seen it begin with a response-time prayer on Sunday mornings, within small groups, and most frequently on Thursday nights in Celebrate Recovery. But most certainly, it will begin with a conversation with a ministry leader or accountability partner. As a church, our desire is that we begin to see the fruits of these discussions and decisions. Are you holding on to an opportunity for a new-found Freedom?
