MAKING THE NEW YEAR TRULY NEW

I do not mean that I am already as God wants me to be. <u>I have not yet reached that goal,</u> <u>but I continue trying to reach it</u> and make it mine. 3 KEY QUESTIONS AS WE START A NEW YEAR:

1. What do I need to put off, and what do I need to put on?

You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to <u>put off your old self</u>, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds; and to <u>put on the new self</u>, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. – Eph. 4:22-24 NIV

The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. <u>So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and</u> <u>put on the armor of light.</u> – Rom. 13:12 NIV

But <u>clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ</u> and forget about satisfying your sinful self. – Rom. 13:14 NCV

And all who have been united with Christ in baptism have put on Christ, like putting on new clothes. – Gal. 3:27 NLT

2. Where are the closed doors, and where are the open doors?

<u>There is a wide-open door for a great work here</u>, although many oppose me. – 1 Cor. 16:9 NLT

"See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut." – Rev. 3:8 NIV

Paul and his companions traveled throughout the region of Phrygia and Galatia, <u>having been</u> <u>kept by the Holy Spirit from preaching the word on the province of Asia</u>. When they came to the border of Mysia, <u>they tried to enter Bithynia</u>, but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them <u>to</u>. So they passed by Mysia and went down to <u>Troas</u>. During the night Paul had a vision of a man of Macedonia standing and begging him, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." After Paul had seen the vision, <u>we got ready at once to leave for Macedonia</u>, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them." – Acts 16:6-10 NIV

3. What is most important, and what is truly unimportant?

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not <u>life more important</u> than food, and <u>the body more important</u>
