Pastor Mark's Remarks

In 2020, we will be reading together through basically the entire Old Testament narrative, by reading one chapter each day. In other words, we will be reading through the stories of the Old Testament, but omitting most of the sections of laws, rituals, genealogies and much of the prophetic material. (We are not suggesting that these sections are unimportant, but we are trying to cover only 366 chapters in 366 days. Thus, major sections had to be omitted.) In addition, we will also read through the wisdom books of Proverbs and Ecclesiastes, and spend just a few weeks sampling several key chapters from among the prophetic books.
